STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

STUDENT DRESS CODE

All Saints Academy takes great pride in its students and expects them to comply with the dress code at all times. **It is the parent's responsibility to see that their child comes to school conforming to the dress code for that day.** All clothing must fit appropriately. No insignia or logo on any clothing (except shoes and socks) other than the official All Saints Academy logo is permitted. The following rules and regulations govern student appearance. All Saints Academy Administration reserves the right to determine if a student is in violation of the dress code policy.

GIRLS K-8

- Pants and shorts must be navy or khaki trouser-style with a flat or pleated front (no cargo or carpenter style). All pants and shorts of students in 2nd-8th grades must have functional belt loops.
- Shorts and skorts must not be shorter than 3" above the knee front or 7" inseam.
- Jumpers and skirts will be uniform plaid (for pattern and color, please refer to Land's End *Classic Navy Plaid*), solid navy or khaki, and no shorter than 3" above the knee front (no cargo or carpenter style). Shorts must be worn under skirts and jumpers at all times.
- Shirts must be white or navy, traditional polo-style with a collar and long or short sleeves with the designated All Saints Academy logo
- Uniform shirts must be worn at all times (including under jumpers and sweatshirts)
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times
- White, gray, or blue quarter zips and sweatshirts, without hoods and waist-length, with the All Saints Academy logo. A uniform shirt must be worn underneath.
- Sweaters in solid navy or white that are waist-length can be worn over a uniform shirt
- Uniform shirts may be worn with a plain white, gray, or navy short or long-sleeved T-shirt or turtleneck underneath
- Socks must be visible and - plain white, gray, black, or navy. (If there is a logo on the socks, it must be either white, gray, black, or navy.)
- Closed-toe dress, casual, or athletic shoes must be worn at all times. Sandals, Crocs, boots, and open-back shoes are not acceptable. Shoes must be able to stay on the students' feet during physical activity.
- Plain brown, black, or navy belts with a standard plain buckle must be worn on pants and shorts by students in grades 2-8
- Jewelry may not be worn other than one pair of stud earrings, in the earlobe only, a wristwatch (no smart watches; in accordance with policy #4007); and one small necklace
- Hair must be neat and clean and kept off the face

- No extreme hairstyles or colors. School does not prohibit hairstyles historically associated with race or ethnicity.
- No makeup except for junior high privilege of concealer and mascara
- No artificial nails
- One, solid-colored nail polish is acceptable
- No coats, jackets, or warm-ups are to be worn in the classrooms during the school day
- No hats or hoods may be worn indoors

BOYS K-8

- Pants and shorts must be navy or khaki trouser-style with a flat or pleated front (no cargo or carpenter style). All pants and shorts of students in 2nd-8th grades must have functional belt loops.
- Shorts must not be shorter than 3" above the knee front or 7" inseam.
- Shirts must be white or navy, traditional polo-style with a collar and long or short sleeves with the designated All Saints Academy logo
- Uniform shirts must be worn at all times (including under sweatshirts)
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times
- White, gray, or blue quarter zips and sweatshirts, without hoods and waist-length, with All Saints Academy. A uniform shirt must be worn underneath.
- Sweaters in solid navy or white that are waist-length can be worn over a uniform shirt
- Uniform shirts may be worn with a plain white, gray, or navy short or long-sleeved T-shirt or turtleneck.
- Socks must be visible and - plain white, gray, black, or navy. (If there is a logo on the socks, it must be either white, gray, black, or navy.)
- Closed-toe dress, casual, or athletic shoes must be worn at all times. Sandals, Crocs, boots, and open-back shoes are not acceptable. Shoes must be able to stay on the students' feet during physical activity.

- Boys' hair may be no longer than the eyebrows, no longer than the middle of the ear, and may not touch the shirt collar
- Hair must be neat and clean and kept off the face
- No extreme hairstyles or colors. School does not prohibit hairstyles historically associated with race or ethnicity.
- No makeup or nail polish
- No coats, jackets, or warm-ups are to be worn in the classrooms during the school day
- No hats or hoods may be worn indoors

P.E. DRESS REQUIREMENTS

All students must wear tennis shoes with socks.

SPIRIT DAYS

All Saints Academy Spirit Shirts and/or Spirit Socks may be worn on designated days. All other dress code

requirements are to be followed - including tucked-in Spirit Shirts.

DRESS DOWN DAYS

While these days are meant to be fun for all, we must first and foremost uphold our Catholic morals and values.

- Shirts must have sleeves
- Logos and designs must be school-appropriate
- Shorts must not be shorter than 3" above the knee front or 5" inseam.
- Clothing may not be cut, torn, or worn out
- Clothing must fit appropriately
- Athletic attire, sweatpants, and jogger pants are acceptable - no leggings
- No pajama attire
- Closed-toe boots with no heels and Crocs with backstraps are permitted. Students and parents must be mindful of appropriate shoes on days the student has P.E.
- **No hats or hoods may be worn indoors**

PICTURE DAY

- Fall pictures will be taken in uniform with the uniform polo - no school-approved sweatshirts or sweaters may be worn for the photo.
- Students may dress up in school-appropriate attire in accordance with "Dress Down Days" requirements for optional Spring pictures.

FAITH FAMILY DAYS

- **Students will wear their school-provided spirit shirt in their Faith Family color with uniform bottoms.** All other dress code requirements are to be followed - including tucked-in shirts.
- **Replacement shirts can be ordered directly from the retailer. Please seek ordering information from the office.**

8th Grade Privilege

- 8th-grade students may earn the privilege of wearing items that do not align with the dress code policy, such as but not limited to the 8th-grade hoodie. These privileges are earned and self-advocated by the current 8th-grade class. Administration has the right to remove privileges on a case-by-case basis.

DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS

Primary: (K-1)

- A warning will be given to students who are not in dress code in the form of a behavior notification in the student information system or teacher email.
- Students may change into clothing that the school has provided. Students should wash and return clothing that is provided by the school.
- Parent/guardian may be called to bring a change of clothes to school

Elementary: (2-5)

- A warning will be given to students who are not in dress code in the form of a behavior notification in the student information system or teacher email.
- Students may change into clothing that the school has provided. Students should wash and return clothing that is provided by the school.
- Parent/guardian may bring a change of clothes to school
- Third and fourth infractions will result in an isolated lunch (lunch eaten in the cafeteria away from other students).
- Fifth infraction will result in a lunch detention (lunch eaten in the office or designated area away from other students).
- Subsequent infractions will result in an office referral

Jr. High: (6-8)

- A warning will be given to students who are not in dress code in the form of a behavior notification in the student information system or teacher email.
- Students may change into clothing that the school has provided. Students should wash and return clothing that the school provides.
- Parent/guardian may bring a change of clothes to school
- The third violation will result in loss of recess and isolated lunch (lunch eaten in the cafeteria away from other students).
- The fourth violation will result in a lunch detention (lunch eaten in the office or designated area away from other students, and a loss of recess).
- Subsequent violations will result in an office referral, which may result in an after-school detention.

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
